Professor in the Department of Medical Oncology, Okayama University

Daisuke Ennishi is a Professor in the Department of Medical Oncology at Okayama University. He received his M.D. in 2002 and Ph.D. in 2011 from Okayama University, Japan. Following his clinical fellowships in hematology, he undertook a postdoctoral fellowship at BC Cancer under the supervision of Drs. Gascoyne, Steidl, and Scott. In 2018, he was appointed as a Clinician-Scientist in the Department of Hematology and Oncology at Okayama University Hospital.

Prof. Ennishi's research focuses on elucidating the molecular pathogenesis of B-cell lymphomas and translating these findings into clinically applicable biomarkers and therapeutic strategies. He has authored over 100 peer-reviewed publications, has been an invited speaker at numerous conferences, and receives research funding from the Japan Agency for Medical Research and Development and the Japan Society for the Promotion of Science. Since 2025, he has served as the Chairman of the Center for Comprehensive Genomic Medicine and the Biobank at Okayama University Hospital.

I have been involved in the translational research using cutting-edge omics platform, and the development of clinical implication of genomic data and biomarkers. I'm looking forward to discussing about current and future "precision-oncology"
